a place that has its own government, laws and way of life • *Australia is a very big country.*

the sport of riding a special bike in the mountains • *Georgia goes mountain biking with her friends on Mount Parnitha.*
- 1.12 mountain** (n) /'maʊntən/
a very high area of land • *Olympus is the highest mountain in Greece.* > mountainous (adj)
- 1.13 karate** (n) /kə'reɪti/
a Japanese sport in which you use your hands and feet to fight • *Kostas has a black belt in karate.*

- 1.14 watermelon** (n) /'wɔ:təmelən/
a large fruit that has a hard green skin and is red and juicy inside • *It's nice to eat a piece of watermelon after dinner in summer.*
- 1.15 pizza** (n) /'pi:tʃə/
a kind of food like flat bread cooked with cheese, tomato, etc. on top • *People in Italy often eat pizza for lunch.*
- 1.16 cheese** (n) /tʃi:z/
a hard round or square shaped food made from milk • *Greek farmers use sheep's milk to make cheese.*
- 1.17 rabbit** (n) /'ræbɪt/
a small animal that has got long ears and a short tail • *Susie has two white rabbits in her garden and they love carrots.*

a kind of small, yellow, orange or red fish

> Argentinian (adj)
- 1.21 mountain bike** (n) /'maʊntən baɪk/
a strong bicycle for riding off road in rocky places • *Be careful! Don't ride your mountain bike so fast down the hill.* > mountain biking (n)
- 1.22 reptile** (n) /'reptəl/
an animal that lays eggs and has cold blood
• *At the zoo, we saw crocodiles and other reptiles.*
- 1.23 kitten** (n) /'kɪtn/
a baby cat • *Mum found a little kitten last year and now it's a lovely big cat.*
- 1.24 snake** (n) /sneɪk/
an animal with a long thin body and no legs
• *I'm not afraid of snakes because they are more afraid of us.*

for sure; certainly • *Of course Anna is Greek. She's from Zakynthos.*
