change the time of an event • *The manager was ill, so we had to reschedule the meeting.*
> schedule (v, n)
- 10.2 enquiry** (n) /ɪn'kwɪəri/
asking for information • *I'd like to make an enquiry about courses at this college.*
> enquire (v)
- 10.3 purchase** (v) /'pɜ:tʃəs/
buy • *He purchased a very expensive car.*
> purchase (n)

- 10.13 fill in** (phr v) /fɪl ɪn/
complete • *Please fill in your name, date of birth and address on this form.*
📎 Syn: complete
- 10.14 application form** (n) /,æplɪ'keɪʃn fɔ:m/
a piece of paper that you complete to apply for sth • *You can get an application from our office.*
- 10.15 for sale** (phr) /fə seɪl/
available to be bought • *I'm sorry, madam. That chair is not for sale.*
- 10.16 acoustic guitar** (n) /ə'ku:stɪk ɡɪ'tɑ:/
a guitar that does not have its sound made louder electronically • *He doesn't play the electric guitar. He plays the acoustic guitar.*
- 10.17 scratch** (n) /skrætʃ/
a mark or an injury made on sth by pulling sth sharp across it • *Who made that scratch on the table?* > scratch (v)
- 10.18 mark** (n) /mɑ:k/
a small cut or other damage • *There's a small black mark on the wall.* > mark (v)
- 10.19 drum kit** (n) /drʌm kɪt/
a set of drums • *Of course she has a drum kit! She plays the drums in a band.*
- 10.20 box office** (n) /bɒks 'ɒfɪs/
a place where tickets are sold for a show, play or film • *I bought five tickets for the play at the box office in the entrance to the theatre.*
- 10.21 live** (adj) /laɪv/
in person, not recorded • *I want to go to the Bon Jovi concert and hear a live performance.*
- 10.22 album** (n) /'ælbəm/
a collection of pieces of music • *His latest album has some great songs.*
- 10.23 lift** (n) /lɪft/
a free ride in a car to a place • *Our car was at the garage, so our neighbour gave us a lift to town.*
- 10.24 hit** (n) /hɪt/
a success • *Elena Papatou's song 'My Number One' was a hit and won the Eurovision song contest in 2005.*
- 10.25 cash** (n) /kæʃ/
money in the form of coins or notes • *I'd like to pay for this in cash.* 📎 in cash = with cash
- 10.26 credit card** (n) /'kredɪt kɑ:d/
a small plastic card that you use to buy things and pay for them later • *I haven't got any cash, so I'll pay by credit card.*
📎 by credit card = with a credit card

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- 10.4 steel drum** (n) /sti:l drʌm/
a drum made of a metal called steel • *Steel drums were first played in Trinidad, but they are popular in Europe too nowadays.*
- 10.5 bagpipes** (pl n) /'bæɡpaɪps/
a musical instrument from Scotland
• *The Scotsman played the bagpipes every morning, which always woke up his neighbours.*
- 10.6 didgeridoo** (n) /dɪdʒə'ri:du:
a musical instrument from Australia which is a very long pipe • *Shane blew into the didgeridoo and it made a low musical sound.*
- 10.7 collect** (v) /kə'lekt/
go somewhere to take sb/sth away to another place • *Mrs Brown is going to collect the children from school.*
> collection (n) 📎 Syn: pick up
- 10.8 sheet music** (n) /ʃi:t 'mju:zɪk/
music that is printed on paper • *This shop sells musical instruments and sheet music.*
- 10.9 series** (n) /'siəri:
set of TV programmes • *The series Bewitched from the 1970s was made into a film in 2005 with Nicole Kidman in the main role.*
- 10.10 film** (v) /fɪlm/
make a film • *They filmed The Lord of the Rings in New Zealand.* > film (n), film-maker (n)
- 10.11 audition** (n) /ɔ:'dɪʃn/
a short performance to see if you can be chosen for sth • *The actor went for an audition but didn't get a part in the play.*
> audition (v)
- 10.12 commence** (v) /kə'mens/
begin • *Shh! The film is going to commence.*
> commencement (n) 📎 Syn: begin; start

- 10.27 note** (n) /nəʊt/
one musical sound • *This song starts on the note 'fa'.*
- 10.28 drummer** (n) /'drʌmə/
sb who plays the drums • *The drummer in our band plays the drums and also sings.*
> drum (v, n)
- 10.29 be sold out** (phr) /bi səʊld aʊt/
be all sold • *We don't have those shoes in your size. They're sold out.*

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- 10.30 reality show** (n) /rɪ'æləti ʃəʊ/
a TV programme which shows real people doing real things • *The reality show 'Big Brother' is popular in many countries.*
- 10.31 soap opera** (n) /səʊp 'ɒprə/
a popular TV drama about the lives of everyday people • *Grandma watches soap operas every day but her favourite is The Bold and The Beautiful.*
- 10.32 producer** (n) /prə'dju:sə/
sb who produces TV shows, plays or films • *Jerry Bruckheimer is a famous producer who is responsible for all the American CSI series.* > produce (v), production (n)
- 10.33 dressing room** (n) /'dresɪŋ ru:m/
a room where actors put on their costumes and make-up before a play • *The actor put on her make-up in her dressing room and waited to be called to go on stage.*
- 10.34 lines** (pl n) /laɪns/
the words an actor must learn for a role • *He was nervous and when he went on stage he forgot his lines and couldn't remember what to say.*
- 10.35 lyrics** (pl n) /'lɪrɪks/
the words of a song • *He knows the lyrics of all the Beatles songs and never gets a word wrong.*
- 10.36 director** (n) /dɪ'rektə/
a person who tells the actors what to do in a film or play • *Steven Spielberg is a brilliant director and I love his films.* > direct (v)

- 10.37 documentary** (n) /dɒkjʊ'mentri/
a programme which gives information about real things • *Did you watch the documentary about the Greek Revolution of 1821?*
- 10.38 script** (n) /skɪpt/
a written form of a film, play or TV show • *My sister writes scripts for films and radio programmes.*
- 10.39 pick up** (phr v) /pɪk ʌp/
collect sb/sth from a place • *Dad forgot to pick me up from school and I had to walk home.*
👉 Syn: collect
- 10.40 perform** (v) /pə'fɔ:m/
act, sing, play an instrument, etc. to entertain people • *The singer performed a few songs for the audience.* > performer (n), performance (n)
- 10.41 open-air theatre** (n) /'əʊpən-eə 'θiətə/
a theatre that has no walls or roof • *I hate open-air theatres. They're too hot in summer and too cold in winter.*
- 10.42 concern** (v) /kən'sɜ:n/
be about sth • *The book concerns the history of the city.* > concern (n)

perform • *She can act, sing and dance, so she has a good chance of getting a part in the musical.* > actor (n), actress (n)
- 10.44 join** (v) /dʒɔɪn/
become a member of a club, a team, etc. • *I'm thinking of joining the drama club.*

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- 10.45 costume** (n) /'kɒstjʊ:m/
the clothes an actor wears for a performance
• *The costumes for the Harry Potter films include wizards' hats and long capes.*
- 10.46 backstage** (adv) /bæk'steɪdʒ/
behind the stage • *The actors whispered backstage while they waited to go on stage.*
- 10.47 performance** (n) /pə'fɔ:məns/
sth that entertains an audience • *We saw a great performance of a play by Aristophanes.*
> perform (v), performer (n)
- 10.48 main** (adj) /meɪn/
the most important • *The main characters in the book are two boys and their mother.*
- 10.49 judge** (n) /dʒʌdʒ/
sb who decides who has won a competition
• *The judges decided to give the prize to me!*
> judge (n), judgement (n)
- 10.50 contemporary** (adj) /kən'tempərəi/
modern • *I prefer contemporary dance to classical ballet.*
- 10.51 rapper** (n) /'ræpə/
sb who performs a rap song • *'Who is your favourite rapper?' 'I don't like rap. I prefer rock.'* > rap (n, v)
- 10.52 academy** (n) /ə'kædəmi/
a college where students learn a particular subject • *I want to study drama at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art.* > academic (adj, n)
- 10.53 Town (Council) Hall** (n) /taʊn ('kaʊnsl) hɔ:l/
a building used for a town's local government
• *There's a meeting to discuss the new road at the Town Hall tomorrow.*
- 10.54 space** (n) /speɪs/
an amount of an area that is empty • *My new bedroom is so small that there's no space for a desk.* > spacious (adj) ☞ Syn: room

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- 10.55 turn away** (phr v) /tɜ:n ə'weɪ/
not allow in • *We went to the new restaurant but were turned away at the door because it was full.*
- 10.56 turn down** (phr v) /tɜ:n daʊn/
make quieter • *Mum is always telling me to turn down my music, but I like it loud!*
- 10.57 turn out** (phr v) /tɜ:n aʊt/
end in a particular way • *The film surprised me because it didn't turn out as I had expected.*
- 10.58 security guard** (n) /sɪ'kjʊəriti gɑ:d/
sb who protects a building from criminals
• *Fred's job is to protect people because he is a security guard at a bank.*

- 10.59 refuse** (v) /rɪ'fju:z/
say that you will not allow sb to have or do sth they want • *The head teacher refused the students permission to have a party in the school hall.* > refusal (n)
- 10.60 admission** (n) /əd'mɪʃn/
entrance • *We paid 20 euros for admission to the club.* > admit (v)
- 10.61 switch on** (v) /swɪtʃ 'ɒn/
turn sth on • *Let's switch the TV on and watch the news.*
- 10.62 be on** (phr) /bi: ɒn/
be broadcast on television; be shown at the cinema • *What's on this weekend at the Rex Cinema?*
- 10.63 decrease** (v) /dɪ'kri:s/
make smaller or quieter • *The amount of noise from the party decreased as we drove away from the house.* > decrease (n)
☞ Opp: increase
- 10.64 volume** (n) /'vɒljʊ:m/
level of noise • *Don't turn the volume up so loud; we won't be able to hear ourselves talking!*
- 10.65 switch off** (phr v) /swɪtʃ ɒf/
turn sth off by pressing a button or switch
• *I want to sleep now. Please switch off the lights.* ☞ Opp: switch on
- 10.66 catch on** (phr v) /kætʃ ɒn/
become popular • *Ballroom dancing has really caught on since the TV reality show Dancing with the Stars was first broadcast.*
- 10.67 weird** (adj) /wɪəd/
very strange • *I heard a weird noise outside my window last night and I was scared.*
- 10.68 give out** (phr v) /gɪv aʊt/
hand to people • *Free newspapers are often given out in the city centre.*
- 10.69 flyer** (n) /'flaɪə/
a leaflet • *We get loads of pizza flyers under our door, but we hardly ever order pizza.*
- 10.70 sell out** (phr v) /sel aʊt/
sell all of sth and have no more • *We couldn't get any tickets for the concert as they had all sold out.*
- 10.71 act out** (phr v) /ækt aʊt/
perform • *The cast acted out the scene before it was filmed so they all knew their lines.*
- 10.72 scene** (n) /si:n/
a part of a film or play • *The best scene in the film was when Harry beat Voldemort!*
- 10.73 grow out of** (phr v) /grəʊ aʊt ɒv/
become too old for • *Most people love watching cartoons and never grow out of them even when they become adults.*

- 10.74** **get sth down** (phr v) /get 'sʌmθɪŋ daʊn/
write down • *I got the announcement down on a piece of paper so I would remember the time of the performance.*
- 10.75** **run out (of)** (phr v) /rʌn aʊt (əv)/
finish a supply of sth • *I can't make a cake because we've run out of eggs.*
- 10.76** **distribute** (v) /dɪ'strɪbjʊ:t/
share things among people • *The pupils distributed flyers for their school play so that many people would come to see them perform.* > distribution (n)
- 10.77** **opening night** (n) /'əʊpənɪŋ naɪt/
the first night that a play is performed or a film is shown • *A lot of famous actors attended the opening night of the play.* 📖 premiere
- 10.78** **reggae** (n) /'reɪgeɪ/
a type of Jamaican music with strong rhythms
• *Bob Marley was a great reggae musician.*

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- 10.79** **festival** (n) /'festɪvl/
a number of performances of music, films, plays, dance, etc. in the same place once a year • *The Glastonbury Festival is one of the most popular music festivals in Britain.*
- 10.80** **employee** (n) /ɪm'plɔɪi:/
sb who is paid to work for sb else • *She has a successful business and she pays her employees well.* > employer (n), employ (v), employment (n)
- 10.81** **exhibit** (n) /ɪg'zɪbɪt/
sth that is put in a public place like an art gallery or museum so that people can go to see it • *There are some interesting exhibits of costumes at the museum.* > exhibit (v), exhibition (n)
- 10.82** **choir** (n) /'kwaɪə/
a group of people who sing together • *The choir sang their last song and then left the stage.*
- 10.83** **concert hall** (n) /'kɒnsət hɔ:l/
a large room in which concerts are held • *The Vienna Symphony Orchestra is giving a performance at the concert hall tonight.*

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- 10.84** **go out** (phr v) /gəʊ aʊt/
stop shining or burning • *The lights went out during the storm.*
- 10.85** **cheer** (v) /tʃɪə/
shout to praise or show support for sb
• *When she finished her speech, everyone cheered enthusiastically.* > cheer (n)
- 10.86** **clap** (v) /klæp/
hit your hands together to show you like sth • *The audience clapped for so long after the play that their hands got tired.*
- 10.87** **pen-pal** (n) /pen-pæl/
a person you make friends with by writing letters • *My mum met her Australian pen-pal for the first time last year.*
- 10.88** **get dressed** (phr) /get drest/
put clothes on your body • *I got out of bed, got dressed and had breakfast.* 📖 Also: dress (v)
- 10.89** **orchestra** (n) /'ɔ:kɪstrə/
a large group of people who play musical instruments together • *She plays the clarinet in the school orchestra.* > orchestral (adj)
- 10.90** **bandurria** (n) /bæn'dʊrɪə/
a musical instrument with strings • *She went to a concert where the musicians were playing unusual instruments like the bandurria.*

- 10.91** **caption** (n) /'kæpʃn/
words under a cartoon • *The captions in some newspaper cartoons are very witty.*
- 10.92** **steelband music** (n) /sti:l'bænd 'mju:zɪk/
music where all the instruments are made of steel • *Steelband music comes from Trinidad and Tobago.*
- 10.93** **avoid** (v) /ə'vɔɪd/
keep away from sb/sth • *You should avoid sitting in the sun between the hours of eleven and three or you'll get burnt.* > avoidance (n)
- 10.94** **rhythm** (n) /'rɪðm/
a regular pattern of sounds • *Hip-hop music has a good rhythm for dancers, which is why it is so popular with them.* > rhythmic (adj)
- 10.95** **tin can** (n) /tɪn kæn/
a round metal container for food or fizzy drink
• *Little kids often make home-made instruments out of tin cans.*
- 10.96** **tune** (v) /tju:n/
make a musical instrument play the right pitch (pitch = how high or low a note is) • *Violinists have to tune their violins before they can play.*

- 10.97 creativity** (n) /kri:ɪ'tɪvəti/
ability to make sth new and imaginative
● *People who make the costumes for science fiction films show a lot of creativity.*
➤ create (v), creation (n), creative (adj)
- 10.98 influence** (v) /'ɪnfluəns/
have an effect on the way sb thinks, behaves or does things ● *The composer Hector Berlioz was influenced by the music of Gluck.* ➤ influence (n), influential (adj)
- 10.99 lively** (adj) /'laɪvli/
enthusiastic and cheerful ● *The party went well because everybody was happy and lively.*
- 10.100 oil drum** (n) /ɔɪl drʌm/
a large round container for oil ● *The oil was stored in oil drums.*
- 10.101 the Caribbean** (n) /ðə ,kæri'bi:ən/
the sea and islands between Central America and South America, west of the Atlantic Ocean
● *I've never been to the Caribbean, but I'd love to go.* ➤ Caribbean (adj)
- 10.102 region** (n) /'ri:dʒən/
a large area of land ● *The Nevada Desert is one of the driest regions of the United States.*
➤ regional (adj)
- 10.103 play music by ear** (expr) /pleɪ 'mju:zɪk baɪ ɪə/
listen to a piece of music and play it without having to read it written down ● *My friend can play music by ear and has never had a music lesson in her life.*
- 10.104 container** (n) /kən'teɪnə/
a thing like a box, bottle, jar, etc. that things are kept in ● *Mum bought a large container of ice cream for the party.*
➤ contain (v)
